Geography Curriculum Statement

- Our geography curriculum aims to inspire our children with a curiosity and fascination about the world and its people that will remain with them for the rest of their lives.
- Through geography, our children will learn about diverse places, people, resources, natural and human environments, gaining an understanding of the Earth's key physical and human processes.
- Our geography curriculum will enable pupils to ask questions, think critically and spatially, use maps, visual images and new technologies, including geographical information systems to analyse and present information, giving them the opportunity to link their understanding with other areas of the curriculum. We enrich this understanding and give them opportunities to discover geographical aspects of their local area – comparing and contrasting this with that of the wider world.
- They will also develop an understanding of how the Earth's features are interconnected and change over time, as well as their responsibilities for our world within and beyond their locality.

Aims of Geography

To ensure that all children:

- Develop contextual knowledge of the location of globally significant places – including their defining physical and human characteristics and how these provide a geographical context for understanding the actions of processes
- Understand the processes that give rise to key physical and human geographical features of the world, how these are interdependent and how they bring about spatial variation and change over time
- Are competent in the geographical skills needed to:
 - Collect, analyse and communicate with a range of data gathered through experiences of fieldwork that deepen their understanding of geographical processes
 - Interpret a range of sources of geographical information, including maps, diagrams, globes, aerial photographs and Geographical Information Systems (GIS)
 - Communicate geographical information in a variety of ways, including through maps, numerical and quantitative skills and writing at length.
