Our aims for PSHE are:

- Our PSHE curriculum enables our children to flourish into healthy, independent and responsible members of society.
- We aim to help children understand how they are developing personally and socially and to give them the skills to tackle many of the moral, social and cultural issues that are part of growing up.
- The PSHE curriculum provides opportunities to learn about rights and responsibilities and appreciate what it means to be a member of a diverse society.
- Our PSHE curriculum is a core element of the social, moral, spiritual and cultural learning that takes place at our school and provides opportunities to build on and reinforce the learning around key values in Collective Worship and across other curriculum areas.
- Our Relationships and Sex Education enables our children to learn how to be safe, and to understand and develop healthy relationships, both now and in their future lives.

Aims of PSHE

To promote the spiritual, moral, cultural, mental and physical development of pupils at our school and of society, and prepare pupils at our school for the opportunities, responsibilities and experiences of later life.

Our PSHE and Citizenship programme (which is covered through the taught curriculum and our wider provision) includes teaching and learning within the following strands and themes:

- **Myself and My Relationships:** including My Emotions, Beginning and Belonging, Anti-bullying, Family and Friends and Managing Change.
- **Healthy and Safer Lifestyles:** including Personal Safety, Digital Lifestyles, Drug Education, Relationships and Sex Education, Healthy Lifestyles and Managing Safety and Risk (including Road Safety).
- **Citizenship:** including Diversity and Communities, Rights, Rules and Responsibilities and Working Together.
- **Economic Wellbeing:** including Financial Capability.
