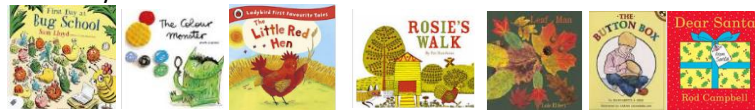
PHONICS

- Little Wandle Phonics

- Phase 2 Tricky words to be recognised by sight
- Sound blending for reading Phase 2 words
- Segmenting Phase 2 words for writing

LITERACY

- Listening to, joining in with and enjoying stories and poems
- Retelling stories by creating and using story maps
- Discussing the characters, settings and story structure of texts
- Innovating stories and creating our own stories
- Mark making for a purpose through 'messages' and using our phonics to write words and simple captions

- Comparing amounts – more/less/fewer/same

- Numeral recognition, matching and ordering numerals
- Developing spatial awareness and using directional language
- Comparing and describing simple 2D shapes

Understanding the World



- Key themes: Similarities and differences What happens at a farm? What happens in autumn?
- Discuss families and important people in the children's lives, children's homes and community life. Noticing and embracing similarities and differences
 - Explore objects from the past and the similarities and differences with today's objects
 - Where some of our food comes from and grows, harvest, vegetables, soup making, bread making
 - Seasons – exploring features of autumn, similarities and differences between other seasons and noticing patterns in the natural world
 - Explore light and dark and habitats of different animals and discuss nocturnal and diurnal animals
 - Share and celebrate different family festivals and celebrations
 - Explore our local environment using maps, church visits and a trip to the local post box

<p>Religious Education</p> 	<p>What is Harvest Festival?</p> <p>Why is the word 'God' so important to Christians?</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • I can remember something that happens in the Bible story of Creation • I can recognise that Christians use God's name with care because God is their Creator • I can recognize that the word 'God' is an important name for Christians • I can talk about when and where people use my name and why • I can talk about something interesting in the Creation story or in the world around me • I can talk about who is important or special to me, my VIP <p>Why do Christians perform nativity plays at Christmas?</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • I can tell part of the nativity story e.g. when dressed as a character or using figures from a crib set • I can recognise something a family is doing at Christmas because they are Christians • I can recognise an image of Jesus e.g. in a nativity set, stained glass window, icon • I can talk about things that happen to me e.g. places I go at the weekend • I can talk about something interesting in a story about Jesus as an adult • I can talk about a person who is important or special to me
<p>Music</p> 	<p>Weekly sessions with Mrs J Taylor, Music teacher</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • To sing, play percussion instruments, control and change sounds and play different pitched sounds. • To create sequences of sound, clap rhythms and create musical patterns. • To use symbols for sounds and clap a beat.
<p>Expressive Art and Design</p> 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Listening to and joining in with a range of songs and dances • Rehearses and performs in the EY/KS1 school Nativity • Uses drawing materials to create pictures with a range of lines and shapes. • Experiments with a range of percussion instruments. • Exploring creating with various media including paint, pencils, pens including colour mixing • Creating a variety of models including recreating objects and people using a range of medium, materials, resources and joining techniques • Retelling and re-enacting stories they have heard in class and acting out their own stories • Accesses small world resources, sometimes playing with others to develop storylines. • ART FORM – Paint Unit: Identifying colour Artist: Anna Llenas Core Skill: Colour identification and colour mixing Medium: Paint

	<p>In the first half term we will focus on the values of Friendship and Generosity. We will consider how true friendship enables each person to grow and ensures that the unique individuality of each person is recognised. We will think about being able to share each other's joys and sorrows. We will consider what it means to be</p>

a good friend, and this will also link to our Anti-bullying week focus early on in the term. We will then move on to consider the joy of being generous, unconditional generosity and giving generously to those in need, loving others as we love ourselves. This will be linked to our celebration of Harvest. In the second half of term, we will explore the idea of Christian Service, considering the actions each of us can take. We will explore these values through stories from the bible and through learning about inspirational people. We will also learn about key festivals including Harvest, Remembrance Day, Advent and Christmas.

We are very grateful for our local clergy and ministers who lead our worship each Wednesday. This term, Rev Nick Moir, vicar of Teversham Parish Church, Sharon Byrne, curate of Teversham Parish Church, Matt Lillicrap, minister of Hope Church, and Danny Driver, vicar of Christ the Redeemer, will be leading us in exploring the theme of Changemakers, leading us to consider how each of us can become Changemakers in the world.
